### PANCAKE DAY 2013 — 12 February

**Shrove Tuesday** (also known as **Pancake Tuesday**, **Pancake Day**, <u>Mardi Gras</u>, and Fat Tuesday) is the day preceding <u>Ash Wednesday</u>, the first day of <u>Lent</u>. Shrove Tuesday is linked to <u>Easter</u>, so its date changes on an annual basis.

The word *shrove* is the past tense of the English verb *shrive*, which means to obtain <u>absolution</u> for one's <u>sins</u> by way of <u>Confession</u> and doing <u>penance</u>. Thus Shrove Tuesday gets its name from the custom for Christians to be "shriven" before the start of Lent. Shrove Tuesday is the last day of "shrovetide", somewhat analogous to the <u>Carnival</u> tradition that developed separately in countries of Latin Europe.

Pancakes are associated with the day preceding Lent because they were a way to use up rich foods such as eggs, milk, and sugar, before the fasting season of the 40 days of Lent. The liturgical <u>fasting</u> emphasized eating plainer food and refraining from food that would give pleasure: In many cultures, this means no meat, dairy, or eggs.

In Canada, Australia, the United Kingdom, Ireland and New Zealand among <u>Anglicans</u>, <u>Lutherans</u>, some other <u>Protestant</u> denominations, including ethnic <u>British</u> communities, as well as Catholics, this day is also known as **Pancake Day**, as it is customary to eat <u>pancakes</u> as a dessert. In the United Kingdom, Shrove Tuesday is observed as a tradition.

Shrove Tuesday was once known as a "half-holiday" in England. It started at 11:00am with the ringing of a church bell. On Pancake Day, pancake races are held in villages and towns across the United Kingdom. The tradition is said to have originated when a housewife from Olney was so busy making pancakes that she forgot the time until she heard the church bells ringing for the service. She raced out of the house to church while still carrying her frying pan and pancake. The pancake race remains a relatively common festive tradition in the UK, and England in particular, even today. Participants with frying pans race through the streets tossing catching pancakes into the air, them in the pan whilst running.
